

9 BABIES die each day from sleeprelated deaths nationwide.*

This includes unintentional suffocation from unsafe sleeping environments like the one shown above.

These safe sleep recommendations could save your baby's life:

Room share, don't bed share.

4 Keep baby warm with a sleep sack or footed pajamas instead of swaddling with blankets.

A crib is the safest place for your baby to sleep.

Your baby should sleep on their back until he or she is strong enough to roll over. No toys, blankets, pillows or bumper pads in the crib.
